Thomas Dörflinger was born on 12 September 1969 in Laupheim. After graduating from the Biberach Gymnasium and subsequently undertaking military service in Mengen and Ummendorf, he completed an apprenticeship as a bank clerk at the Landesgirokasse Stuttgart. He then studied business administration at the University of Applied Sciences in Nürtingen, graduating with a Diploma in Business Administration (FH). Thomas Dörflinger went on to work as a fund-of-funds manager and fund researcher at the Baden-Württembergische Bank and later as an asset manager at the Kreissparkasse Biberach.

Thomas Dörflinger has been a member of the Baden-Württemberg Landtag (state parliament) since 2016. During this time he has served as the spokesperson for skilled crafts and trades policy for the CDU parliamentary group. From 2017 to 2026, he was also Chair of the Transport Working Group and spokesperson for transport policy. From 2021 to 2026, he served as Deputy Chair of the CDU parliamentary group. In March 2026, he was re-elected to the Baden-Württemberg State Parliament.

Thomas Dörflinger lives with his family in the municipality of Ummendorf in the district of Biberach. He is a member of various associations and is active, amongst other roles, as chairman of the board of trustees of the Ummendorf Community Foundation.

On 13 May 2026, Thomas Dörflinger was appointed State Secretary in the Ministry of Economic Affairs, Skilled Crafts and Tourism of the State of Baden-Württemberg.
